What is the EUJTF?




- The centrepiece of the European Union's project to make the continent climate neutral, the European Green Deal strives
 to cut carbon emissions, decouple the economy from fossil fuels, and improve the wellbeing, health and opportunities of
 current citizens and future generations.
- The EU Just Transition Fund (JTF) was created to alleviate the socio-economic impacts of this new economic environment and to ensure no-one is left behind. The programme was created to support regions throughout Europe that are experiencing negative impacts from the transition away from fossil fuel-intensive industries.
- The funding programme in Ireland is supporting the areas in the wider Midlands where communities have been negatively affected by the closure of peat production and peat-fired energy generation facilities.
- Co-funded by the Government of Ireland and the European Union, up to €169 million is available over the duration of the fund. The investment is targeted to support the diversification of local economies and the creation of new opportunities that complement the assets of the Territory. The fund will also restore degraded peatlands and regenerate industrial heritage assets, as well as invest in smart and sustainable local mobility so that local communities are able to benefit from the economic opportunities and amenities.


