1. Adoption of Minutes of Meeting held on 14th March 2025

3. Presentation from Irish Rail

Barry Kenny, Head of Corporate Communications with larnród Éireann, gave a presentation on the current and future plans of Irish Rail. This included specific projects in the Southern Region such as Rosslare Europort, Limerick, and Cork, as well as capital projects at national level.

There were several contributions from Members, including a query on how Irish Rail's plans are aligned to the work of the Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy.

4. Regional Development Monitor - Introductory Session for SRA members
Justin Gleeson, Director of AIRO, presented an online introductory session on the
Regional Development Monitor (RDM), which is a collaboration between the Regional
Assemblies, and captures data from various sources to create information at local and
regional levels.

Many of the Members complimented the RDM as a strong tool for accessing resources and hoped to attend the next information session when the date is confirmed.







9. Any Other Business

Cllr. Thomas Phelan suggested that the Assembly could possibly create an induction/information pack for newly elected/co-opted representatives on local authorities to give a better sense of what role the Assembly plays.

Cllr. Kieran McCarthy informed the Members that Cork City Council will host European Maritime Day in May.

The Director informed the Members about a recent FOI request submitted to the Assembly in relation to Members allowances and expenses.

The Director also reminded Members, of the Regional Alliance that the Assembly signed up to in 2024, and that a joint letter is being prepared to be sent to the EU E.V.P. Fitto on the future of Cohesion Policy, and that a request has been received for the Assembly to sign up again to the alliance in 2025.

The launch of the new Assembly website was announced by the Director, with Members encouraged to view the new layout.

Cllr. Kieran McCarthy highlighted the discussions on the future of Cohesion Policy which is currently taking place at EU level, and the importance of the Committee of the Regions being part of the debate.


