








Consultation Overview

































Challenges in implementing SMART and Sustainable Mobility projects for residents & commuters in the region.

The primary challenge/barrier indicated from the survey results, when it comes to implementing Smart and Sustainable Mobility projects for residents and commuters in the region was **Resistance to Change**. Encouraging behavior change among the public is a significant challenge, as some local residents oppose proposed changes, leading to controversies and obstacles in the implementation of sustainable mobility solutions.

Followed by other significant challenges, such as, lack of Staff. Closely following that, Lack of Sufficient Funding, particularly the lack of integration between the Connecting Ireland and Active Travel programs

Challenges in seamless integration of various modes of transport. Fragmented/siloed nature of transport system.














Tools, skills, and Knowledge Gaps

A notable and interesting finding from the survey was that respondents are seeking specific tools, skills and knowledge in understanding Emerging technologies and their relevance to Mobility Projects and are also additionally interested in comprehension of Behavioural Change Strategies for Sustainability.

The third most popular response is **Technical Skills**. Implementing Smart and Sustainable Mobility projects often involves integrating various technologies, such as Intelligent Transportation Systems, sensors, IoT devices, and communication networks, and a number of Local Authorities indicated that that require expertise in identifying suitable technologies, procuring, managing integration, and ensuring interoperability among different systems.

Additionally, support in **engaging with stakeholders effectively** was also highlighted as a skill gap.
















Type of support required

Overall, the selection of these areas by survey respondents indicates a desire for professional growth, collaboration, and access to resources that can enhance their skills, knowledge, and effectiveness in their respective roles. Areas highlighted as critical for support are:

- 1. Access to Case Studies
- 2. Networking Events and Knowledge Sharing Platform.
- 3. Technical Assistance and Guidance (Advisory services).
- 4. Opportunities for working as part of a multidisciplinary team.
- 5. Mentoring support from Experts.
- 6. Expertise in Securing Financing for Projects.

The survey highlights the recognition of the value of networking, multidisciplinary teamwork, expert guidance, and learning from successful experiences to advance their careers and contribute to their organizations' success.































Sustainable Mobility Academy
