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1 Introduction

Smart and Sustainable Mobility Accelerator programme

The Smart and Sustainable Mobility Accelerator (SSMA) programme is a comprehensive training and capacity-building workshop programme designed to support Local Authorities and Stakeholders in accelerating the implementation of smart and sustainable mobility projects. This initiative aligns with the National Sustainable Mobility Policy (SMP) Action Plan 2022-2025 and aims to drive positive change throughout our regions.

The Smart and Sustainable Mobility Accelerator (SSMA) programme is led by the Southern Regional Assembly, Eastern and Midland Regional Assembly, and the Northern and Western Regional Assembly with the support of the Department of Transport under the Pathfinder programme.

1.1 Objectives

The programme aims to achieve the following objectives:

• **Knowledge and Skills Enhancement**: Equip participants with the necessary knowledge, skills, and tools to address the complexities of sustainable mobility.













- Insights from national and international case studies will be shared to foster innovation and best practices.
- **Collaboration Strengthening**: Foster cross-sectoral collaboration among Local Authorities, Councillors, Community Representatives, and the Business Sector. This collaborative effort will support the implementation of LA Active Travel, Smart Mobility Initiatives and Climate Action Initiatives.
- **Behavioural Change Promotion**: Encourage community empowerment and behavioural change towards sustainable mobility modes, thereby reducing transport emissions and promoting a sustainable future for Ireland.

1.2 Expected outcomes and benefits:

- 1. **Empowerment and Skill Development**: The SSMA programme provides comprehensive training and mentoring, empowering participants to take effective actions for sustainable mobility. This programme equips them with the necessary skills to navigate complex challenges and drive positive change.
- 2. **Sustainable Mobility Platform**: Utilise an online platform dedicated to effective communication, collaboration, and progress monitoring. Participants can share progress reports for lighthouse projects and exchange knowledge and best practices.
- 3. **Tools for Collaboration and Co-creation:** Participants will acquire essential tools and techniques for effective collaboration, including communication and consultation skills. These skills will enable them to engage with stakeholders, foster partnerships, and co-create solutions that align with the needs of their communities.
- 4. **Capacity Building:** The SSMA Project offers an intensive capacity-building training experience. This structure will ensure immersive learning and allows participants to delve deep into the subject matter.
- 5. **Immersive and Interactive Workshops:** Engage in hands-on workshops that facilitate active learning and participation. Participants will have the opportunity to exchange ideas and collaborate with their peers in a dynamic learning environment.
- 6. **Cross-Sectoral Task Forces**: Establish task forces that leverage the expertise and resources of various sectors. These task forces will play a crucial role in implementing sustainable mobility initiatives and driving positive change.
- 7. **Selection of Lighthouse Projects**: Each Local Authority participating in the SSMA Project will have the opportunity to develop a lighthouse project. These projects will serve as models for others, showcasing best practices and innovative approaches. Participants will have the chance to contribute to and shape these projects, gaining hands-on experience in project development and implementation.

2 SSMA CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP OUTLINE

Capacity Building Workshops

A key component of the programme is the Capacity Building Workshops. The workshops have a central goal of promoting the integration and execution of intelligent and sustainable mobility solutions within the mobility sector in Ireland. A cross-regional learning approach will be adopted during these workshops. Each workshop training programme is customised













to suit a specific group of participants known as a **Track**. The central focus of these tracks is to promote cross-sectorial collaboration and leadership, by offering knowledge of advanced technical systems, models, and best practices.

The workshops will be divided into four distinct Tracks which will be tailored for four different target groups and will be held between September 2023 and December 2025.

The Capacity Building Workshop Tracks under the SSMA programme are as follows:

- **Track 1**: Local Authority Staff (Target Group 1).
- ➤ **Track 2**: Elected Councillors (Target Group 2).
- ➤ **Track 3**: Innovation Actors (Target Group 3).
- > Track 4: Community Representatives (Target Group 4).

Each track is profiled into different workshop training programmes tailored to a specific cohort of participants. The Capacity Building Workshops will be coordinated and organised by the **Regional Assemblies**, in collaboration with the Department of Transport, as part of the Pathfinder Programme. The programme focus for 2023 will concentrate on Track 1, which is targeted at Local Authority Staff.

2.1 Track 1 Overview

Track 1: Local Authority Staff

Track 1 will start with an interactive in-person training **Kick-Off** within the three regions in Ireland followed by **five Half-Day** virtual training sessions and ending with an all-comprehensive **Final Conference** in which all the regional assemblies will take part in person. Track 1 is scheduled to commence from the **25**th **of September until the 15**th **of November 2023**, followed by tailor-made mentoring sessions for the rest of the programme duration.

The primary objective of this Track is to foster collaboration across different sectors and empower mobility stakeholders to take on leadership roles. Through a series of workshops, this track is dedicated to assisting Local Authorities in embracing and executing intelligent and sustainable mobility solutions. Attendees will gain valuable knowledge and insights into state-of-the-art technical systems, models, and best practices to drive progress in the field of smart and sustainable mobility.

Primary aims of Track 1:

- ➤ To support Local Authorities and help address shared challenges in the implementation of smart and sustainable mobility projects with local communities.
- > To strengthen cross-sectoral collaboration and support leadership for smart and sustainable mobility actions.
- ➤ To build capacity for demonstrating and communicating to the public and key stakeholders the positive before and after impacts of sustainable mobility projects occurring across our Local Authorities to encourage good practice replication.
- ➤ To strengthen behaviour change to active travel look at good practice techniques and interventions, to help achieve our target of a 50% reduction in transport emissions and 500,000 extra walking, cycling and public transport journeys by 2030.













The following section provides a detailed overview of the Track 1 Programme Elements.

2.1.1 Kick-Off

Each Kick-Off session will be divided into two modules, each taught by two distinguished experts – one from Ireland and another from BABLE. The training sessions are scheduled to run from **09:30** to **16:30**, providing participants with comprehensive learning opportunities throughout the day.

A lunch break, from 12:30 to 13:30, will offer a chance for participants to relax and rejuvenate before diving back into the interactive session. Additionally, several shorter breaks interspersed between the modules will ensure that attendees have ample time to absorb the knowledge and interact with their peers effectively.

Kick-Off dates are as follows:

- **1. Southern Regional Assembly**: Monday, 25th of September 2023 at the Millennium Hall, City Hall, Cork City Council.
- **2. Eastern and Midland Regional Assembly**: Wednesday 27th of September 2023 at the Davenport Hotel, 8-10 Merrion Street Lower, Dublin 2.
- **3. Northern and Western Regional Assembly**: Friday 29th of September 2023 at Bush Hotel, Carrick on Shannon.

2.1.2 Virtual Half-Day Sessions

The virtual half-day sessions will span across five weeks in each region, and they will be conducted as half-day sessions. These interactive online sessions will cover various topics, and the specific schedule and details for each session will be communicated during the Kick-Off meeting. Participants from different regions will have the opportunity to engage and collaborate virtually, making it a comprehensive and accessible learning experience for all. The virtual training sessions for each region will occur on the same weekday consistently. All half-day sessions will **start at 09:00 and end at 13:00**.

Tentative schedule:

- 1. Southern Region (Tuesday).
- 2. Eastern and Midland Region (Wednesday).
- 3. Northern and Western Region (Friday).

In between the virtual sessions, they will be a **Break Week** from the 30^{th} of October to the 3^{rd} of November to accommodate the public holiday period. During this time, there will be no virtual sessions to allow participants to take a well-deserved rest and accommodate the holiday period.

2.1.3 Final Conference

The Final Conference will be the concluding event for Track 1 and will require all three Regional Assemblies to convene for a comprehensive in-person closing event. This gathering is currently scheduled for the **15**th of November 2023 and with the location to be finalised. The conference will be a full-day event offering Local Authorities staff a platform to showcase diverse mobility-related projects and initiatives spanning across Ireland as well as an opportunity to consolidate the lessons learned.













2.1.4 Ongoing Mentorship

Track 1 will also include Ongoing Mentorship sessions where participants will be able to get support and input from experts during the capacity-building virtual sessions as well as after the final conference. Details will be defined based on the training participant's areas of interest.

Upon successful completion of the training programme, participants will receive a certificate of achievement, recognizing their commitment to professional development in the field of smart and sustainable mobility.
