### **Interreg Europe objective**

To improve regional development policy instruments (including Investment for jobs and growth goal programmes)

#### How?

Through exchange of experience, innovative approaches and capacity building

- Primarily dedicated to policymakers
- Focus on exchange of experience



Different from cross-border or transnational cooperation

### What is a **policy instrument**




#### A means for **public intervention**:

- a strategy, programme or law
- developed by public authorities
- applied to improve a specific territorial situation

Investment for jobs and growth goal programmes are policy instruments.

### **Example of a policy instrument**



The Regional Spatial & Economic Strategy (RSES) for the Southern Region of Ireland provides the roadmap for effective regional development to implement:

- the National Planning Framework (NPF)
- the relevant economic policies and objectives of the Government

#### policy responsible authority

### What is a 'policy responsible authority'



- The **organisation in charge** of the elaboration and/or delivery of a specific **policy instrument**
- In most cases, a **public** institution

### What is a policy improvement



Our projects report three types of results:

- New projects
- Change in governance
- Change in the policy instrument itself



Limited number of regions exchanging and transferring experience on a shared regional development issue


