European Urban Initiative (EUI)-EMRA as National Contact Point

EMRA was appointed Urban Contact Point (UCP) for the European Urban Initiative (EUI) last December (2023), following nomination by the DHLGH.

This followed EMRA's recent re-appointment as National URBACT Point (NUP) through to 2027; first appointed in 2018.

Both programmes in tandem enable EMRA to support all local authorities across the three Irish regions in the realm of Sustainable Urban Development (SUD), especially through both programmes' calls and opportunities for our towns and cities.

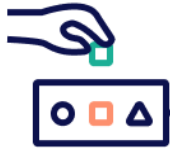
European Urban Initiative (EUI)-its origins

Origins: during the period 2014-2020, €115 billion from Cohesion policy funds were invested in cities, with €17bn of this managed directly and implemented locally by urban authorities through almost 1,000 sustainable urban development strategies.

Alongside these, the Urban Innovative Actions (UIA) initiative provided direct support for cities to experiment with innovative solutions. The Urban Development Network (UDN) was also configured to support the communication and the exchange of information between "article 7 cities" (cities committed to implementing sustainable urban development), the UIA cities and the European Commission.

[The EUI](#) consolidates the UIA and UDN into one initiative, giving concrete support to cities; fostering city-led innovation, the sharing of urban knowledge, practice, and to further build capacity. It has a total ERDF budget of €450m for 2021-27.

During this 2014-2020 period, the URBACT III programme was helping cities too. The URBACT IV Programme remains an additional and popular option for Irish local authorities. **More on this later.**

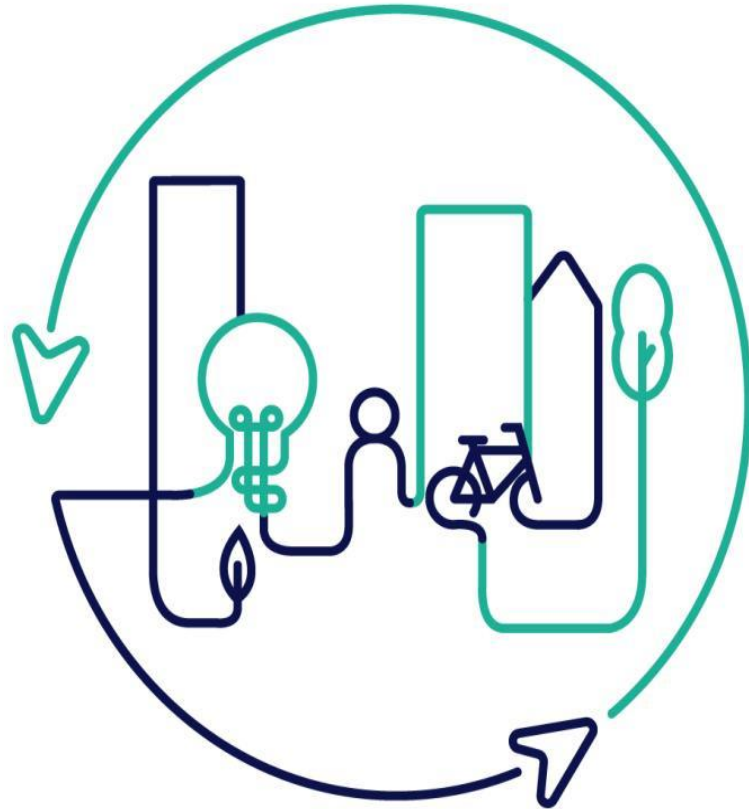


Innovative Actions: the EUI supports projects which are:

- INNOVATIVE (**not implemented previously in EU**)
- PARTICIPATORY
- MEASURABLE
- SUSTAINABLE AND SCALABLE
- TRANSFERABLE

Implemented in **partnership**. Prepared with a leading role for the **city as a strategic partnership leader**. Planned to **achieve the goals of local strategies and policies**. In line with the spirit of the principles of good urban governance according to the **New Leipzig Charter**. Fostering local **innovation ecosystem**.

Innovative Actions- key features



- **Financial support:** €315m available with up to EUR 5 million ERDF (maximum co-financing rate of 80%)
- **Beneficiaries:** urban authorities (associations or groupings of urban authorities) with a total population of more than 50k inhabitants
- **Implementation period:** 3.5 years
- **Thematics:** each time defined by the European Commission and based on themes identified in the Urban Agenda for the EU;
 - Call 1 : New European Bauhaus
 - Call 2 : Greening cities, Sustainable tourism, Harnessing talent in shrinking cities
 - [Call 3: Energy Transition & Technology in Cities \(closes Oct 14th\)](#) - €90m available with up to 20 projects funded*

Capacity Building Opportunities



EUI Capacity Building

One target: EU cities of all sizes involved in Sustainable Urban Development

Two objectives: accompany cities in their road towards sustainable urban development & improve the design and overall implementation of sustainable urban development strategies, policies and practices

Examples: City-to-City Exchanges, Peer Reviews and Events

City-to-City Exchanges



Brings together a city facing a specific problem related to sustainable urban development ('the applicant')

And another 1-2 cities from a different EU Member State with expertise to help tackle this challenge ('the peer')

Simple application form, quickly implemented visit (between 2 and 5 days)

Depends entirely on city needs and the challenge they wish to put forward!

Open to all cities (in category DEGURBA 1 (urban) or 2(suburban))

External stakeholders can participate if it is duly justified in the application form.

Peer Reviews



- What: an activity aimed at helping cities to design/improve their Sustainable Urban Development strategies
- How (method): throughout exchange and joint work with peers around Europe
- Who, 2 possible roles: City under Review or Peer Reviewer
- Main milestone: 2-day event that brings together 3 Cities under Review, each with their group of 6 Peer Reviewers
- It's a process, goes beyond the actual event

Eligibility-general comment

The applicant local administrative unit ("LAU" - of which Ireland has 166) should be classified as urban or sub-urban (this classification is provided by Eurostat - first informed by census data).

This criterion is important for both Innovative Actions and Capacity Building (CB) activities. Article 11 "cities" (includes towns...) are eligible for CB.

A further criterion for Innovative Actions' projects is a population of 50k+ inhabitants in the urban/suburban location applying to the call. Reach out for more precise determination re eligibility. **Population is not a barrier for CB activities.**

Portico then suggests matches between urban authorities having analysed the information about urban authorities and their challenges, solutions, project ideas against the existing information in its database, and considered the eligibility criteria for EUI - IA and CB – C2C Exchange. It is possible to save the suggestions and directly contact the author of the challenge/solution.

In line with the existing application form for C2C Exchanges, urban authorities looking for a peer with expertise, or those with expertise willing to share are required to identify themselves through Creating a challenge form or Publish your solution.

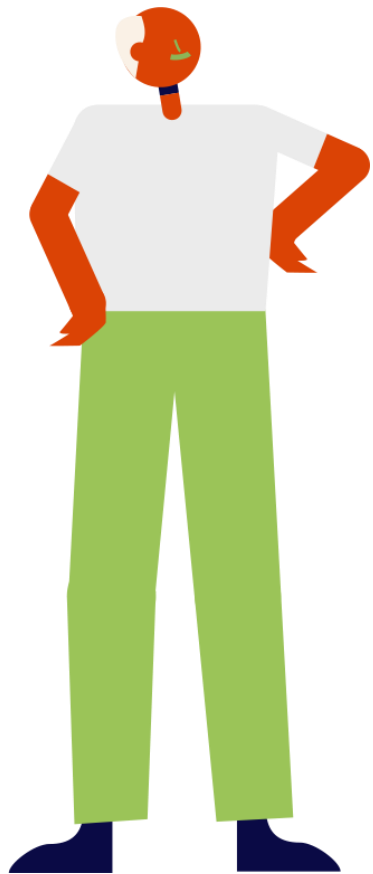
Thematic Partnerships are formed gathering stakeholders from different levels and different sectors



Action Plans are being drafted and implemented by the Thematic Partnerships to address the challenges



How do Thematic Partnerships work?



Duration: 3 years (including development & implementation of Action Plan)

Overall guidance by Coordinators

Orientation > Draft Action Plan > Action Plan > Implementation

Actions contributing to UAEU pillars (better regulation, funding, knowledge)

- Actions are commonly defined
- Action leaders are coordinating the work on specific actions

In average 2 in-person **meetings** and 4 – 6 online meetings per year

Working language is **English**.

Partnerships are supported by the **European Urban Initiative**

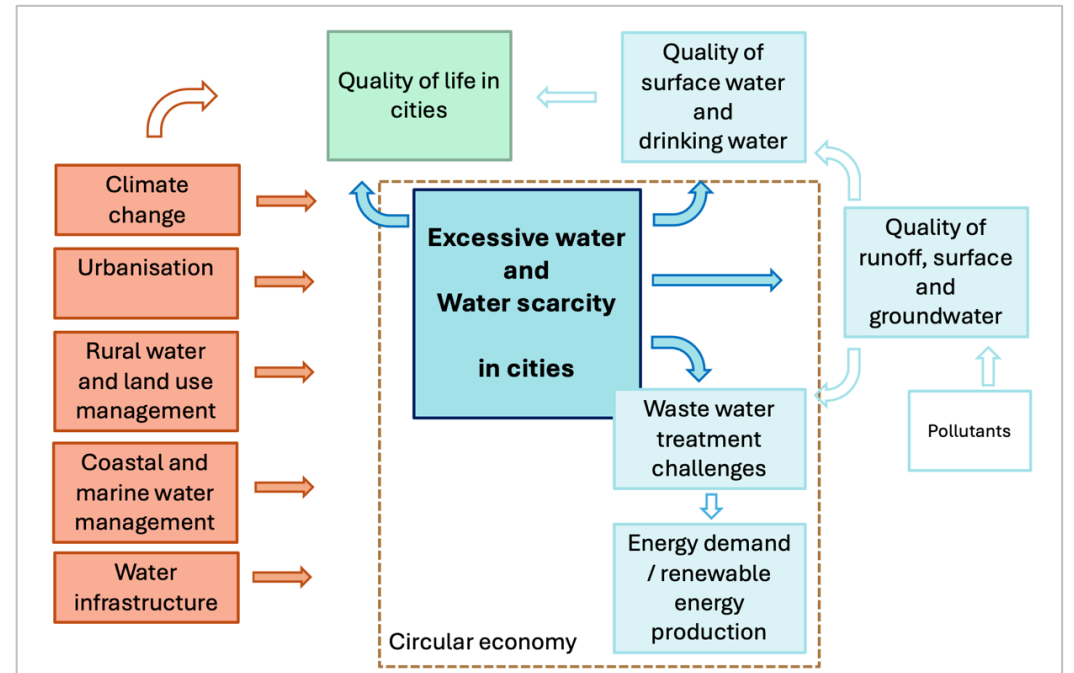

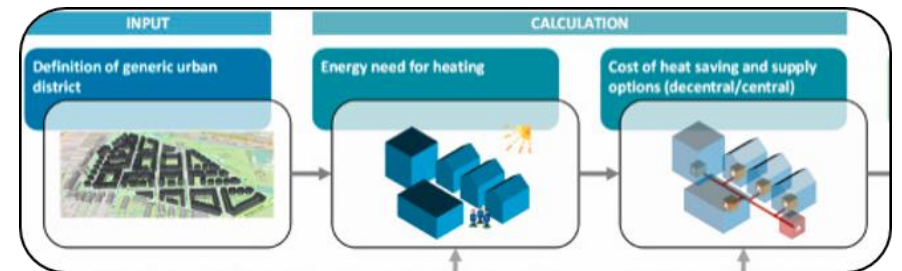

Cities and local stakeholders co-produce an Integrated Action Plan to tackle their common policy challenges.



Cities share and adapt a successful Good Practice **that has already been implemented in their Network's lead city.**



Cities adapt the experience of a successful Urban Innovative Actions' project **and develop an investment plan to implement it.**

Key expected result

Integrated Action Plan (IAP)

An IAP will offer towns & cities a concrete response to their urban policy challenge.

The IAP follows an intervention logic which aims to design and implement actions based on testing.

The IAP will link the town/cities actions to the broader Cohesion Policy funds to support long term implementation and lasting change.

URBACT coverage in Ireland



Coverage: the geographical spread continues to improve

- Red dot denotes the participants of the National Practice Transfer Initiative –NPTI (June 2021)
- Coverage has improved further under URBACT IV (green dot)-Action Planning Networks (May 2023)
- Dublin saw two further applications successful under the recent ITN call (orange x)-Innovation Transfer Networks (will begin in October 2024)

Snapshot: current URBACT Action Planning Networks in IE

- Biodiversity (Limerick): scientific, measuring urban Biodiversity by exploring different community-based approaches, greening plans and pro environmental behaviours
- GREENPLACE (Limerick): restoring forgotten urban spaces and making such places welcome to resident, using existing resources and in an environmentally friendly way
- UR-IMPACT (Longford): ensuring social inclusion and community development during times of urban renewal/regeneration
- Cities at Heart (Sligo): trying to reverse loss of attractiveness in cities and towns of different sizes and backgrounds

Snapshot: current URBACT Action Planning Networks in IE

- EcoCore (Fingal): focusing on green growth and transition in small cities along the respective transport corridors, especially regarding the use of energy and transportation
- Econnecting (Clare) *seeks to help create strong links and the involvement of citizens in developing proximity strategies for rural-urban functional areas.*
- In4green (Meath): overcoming barriers preventing transition to greener economics while staying inclusive and competitive!

Focus: Cork City & the Playful Paradigm

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- Cork City was initially a partner of the Playful Paradigm network lead by Udine, Italy
- The practice aimed to increase the opportunities for play throughout a city. The practice was modular, i.e. cities could implement as few or as many of the practices, and at a variety of scales, as their inclination and resources permitted.
- Cork successfully implemented the Good Practice, and the original action plan was in fact surpassed.
- Cork later engaged in a NPTI (a pilot transfer network) which saw its Good Practice transferred to five partner towns in Ireland (Rathdrum, Donegal, Rush, Sligo and Portlaoise). Population ranged between 1,663 to 22,050!
- Initiative occurred for 18 months (June 2021 – Dec' 2022) with a final event in Sligo seeing 65 attendees & national and international keynotes, as well as play demonstrations on the streets of Sligo!
