Southern Regional Assembly Gathers for First Meeting in Waterford

The first meeting of the new Southern Regional Assembly took place today in Waterford, Friday 12th July 2024. The new term sees 19 former members returning alongside 15 elected members serving their first term on the Assembly, including for the first time, the directly elected Mayor of Limerick.

Following the recent local elections, every local authority in the region (Carlow, Clare, Cork City, Cork County, Kerry, Kilkenny, Limerick & Tipperary, Waterford and Wexford) nominates elected members to the regional assembly for the five-year term. The regional assembly is part of the regional tier of government in Ireland and has responsibility for EU funded Programmes and regional planning.

Cllr. Garret Kelleher, Cork City Council, Fine Gael has been elected as the Cathaoirleach 2024-25, succeeding Cllr. Terry Shannon from Cork City Council. Cllr Ken Murnane Carlow County Council was elected as Leas Cathaoirleach.

Cllr Kelleher, Cathaoirleach said:

"I am honoured to wear the Chain of Office as Cathaoirleach of the Southern Regional Assembly. The functions of the Regional Assemblies have become increasingly important as the regional tier of government and key champions of the regional perspective in economic and spatial development. I am looking forward to working with my colleagues across the political spectrum on the very significant programme of work ahead, including a review of the Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy for the Southern Region and the adoption of the next Corporate Plan for the Assembly."

Congratulating the new Cathaoirleach and Leas-Cathaoirleach, Director of the Assembly, David Kelly said that he and all the staff in the Assembly look forward to working with them and the new Assembly over the coming years.



About the Southern Regional Assembly

Based in Waterford city, the <u>Southern Regional Assembly</u> is the regional tier of government in Ireland with a remit for the Southern Region. The Southern Region covers the local authorities of Kilkenny, Carlow, Waterford, Wexford, Tipperary, Cork City, Cork County, Kerry, Clare and Limerick. The Regional Assembly has 34 Members representing the ten local authorities at regional level, 27 appointed by their local authority and six as Committee of the Regions Members.

The Regional Assembly forges links between EU, national and local levels through regional spatial and economic planning and European Regional Development Funding (ERDF) for the benefit of the Southern Region. It is responsible for strategic regional and economic planning and supporting balanced, sustainable regional development by:

- ➤ Leading the implementation of the Regional Spatial & Economic Strategy (RSES).
- Promoting balanced regional development through the management of, support for, and involvement in European Regional Development Fund (<u>ERDF</u>) funded programmes and projects.
- ➤ Linking local, regional, national and EU policy goals through regional planning and EU regional development.
